Tree Planting Survey

Designed to determine:

- Who plants trees in Fairfax County?
- Who helps homeowners acquire, plant, or plan for trees?
- Who is supplying trees for planting?
- How are tree plantings financed?
- What are the problems and barriers to tree planting?
- How many trees are planted?
- Who is interested in planting in the future?






Respondent Insight

- Roughly half of respondents plant trees
- Half partner with other organizations
- Four main providers of planting material
- A variety of barriers and problems

- Identify new and existing funding sources
- Finalize recommendations on low and no-cost options
