
September 2019

BRT Public Meeting September 17, 2019

Fairfax County will hold a **third Public Information Meeting** on the **Richmond Highway Bus Rapid Transit** (BRT) project on Tuesday, September 17, 2019 at 7 p.m. The meeting will be held in the gymnasium at **Bryant High School** located at 2709 Popkins Lane in Alexandria. The meeting will feature an open house from 6:30 - 8:30 p.m., with a **presentation at 7 p.m.** Fairfax County Department of Transportation (FCDOT) staff and project consultants will provide **updates on the BRT project** (including the system design and potential property impacts), discuss next steps, **answer questions** and **take public comments** from the community related to the planning and design of the BRT system. **Free transportation from select locations, on-site childcare and Spanish translation** will be provided. Made in Fairfax Network




