

LAND USE ACTIONS

During the 2nd quarter of Fiscal Year 2022 the Planning Commission acted on **32** applications; affording 17 citizens an opportunity to speak at the 9 public hearings held. The district with the highest number of applications considered was the Providence District with 12 applications acted upon.



COMMITTEE ACTIVITY

Policy and Procedures Committee

Met on October 7th with the staff of the Planning Commission and reviewed the proposed updated Planning Commission Bylaws discussed at the April 8, 2021, meeting. The Committee voted unanimously to recommend to the full Planning Commission adoption of the amended bylaws dated October 5, 2021.

Land Use Process Review Committee

Met on November 18th with the Department of Planning and Development staff for a presentation on the Public Facilities Policy Plan Update. Staff updated the Committee on the progress of the plan and the next steps. Committee members shared their feedback with staff and asked to be more involved in the public facilities plan process.


Tysons Committee

On December 9th the Committee was constituted. Phillip A. Niedzielski-Eichner was elected Chairman. Deputy County Executive, Rachel Flynn, gave a presentation to the Committee on placemaking. The Committee discussed the ideas presented by Ms. Flynn and made suggestions for future planning in Tysons, as well as throughout the County.

Transportation Committee

On December 9th the Committee was constituted. Mary D. Cortina was elected Chairman. The Fairfax County Department of Transportation staff gave a presentation to the Committee on the ActiveFairfax Transportation Plan, which included a review of the Project Overview, Public Engagement Summary, Vision, Goals and Objectives for Active Transportation, and the Proposed Safe Streets for All Program.
