The governmental center is also home to the Sully District Police Station, so the parking lot is monitored by video camera 24 hours a day.



Who are we in Fairfax County in 2018?

According to the recently released <u>2018 Demographics Report</u> there are an estimated 1,152,873 of us and 418,250 housing units. Our median household


income is \$118,279, yet an estimated 6 percent of our neighbors live in poverty.

The county's annual demographics report features critical insights into who we are in Fairfax County - our ethnicity, housing costs, as well as income and forecasts of population and housing units, among several other indicators. This information is used by the Board of Supervisors, county executive, and county agencies to make informed and strategic decisions on the services provided to our community, as well as the county's budget and economic future.


